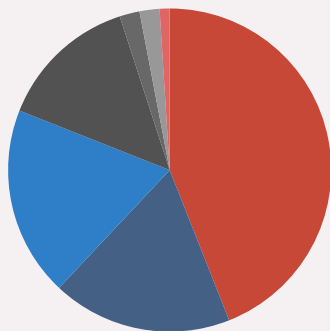

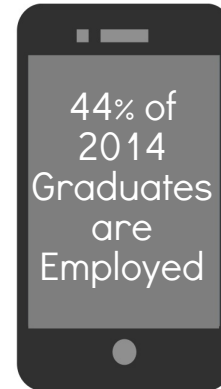

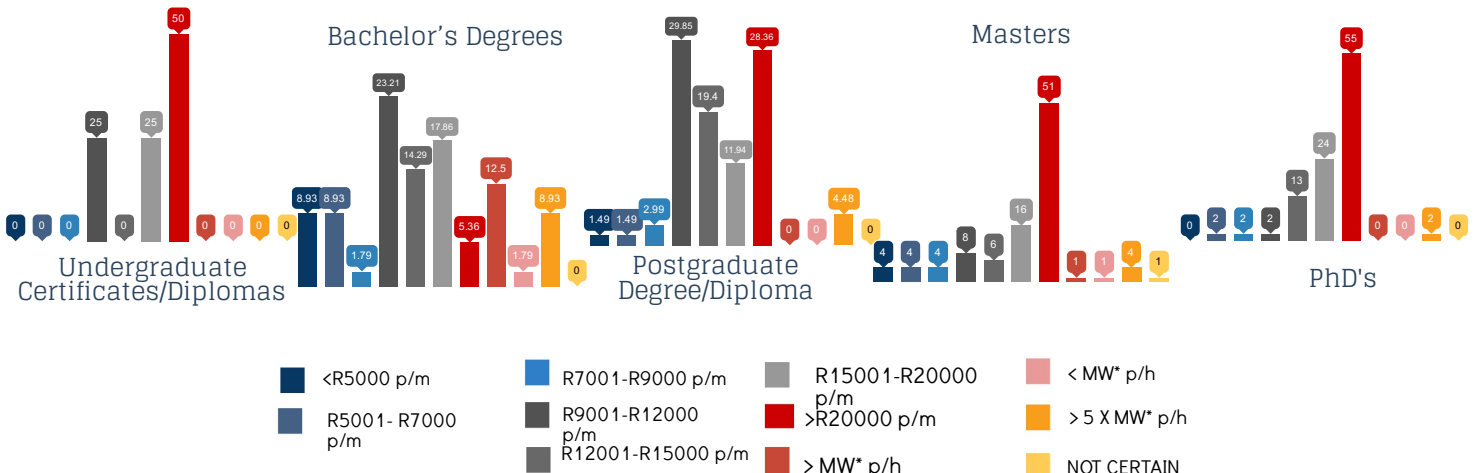
Overview of Employment Sectors

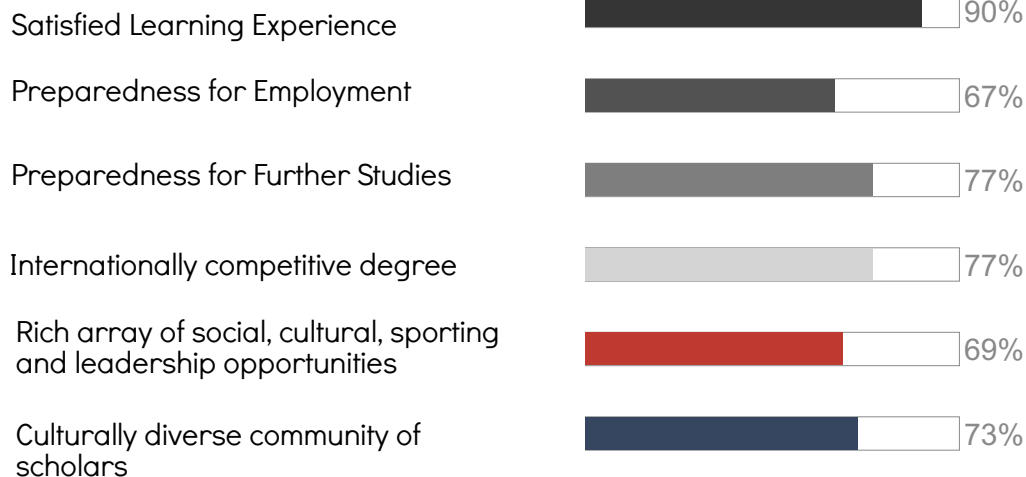

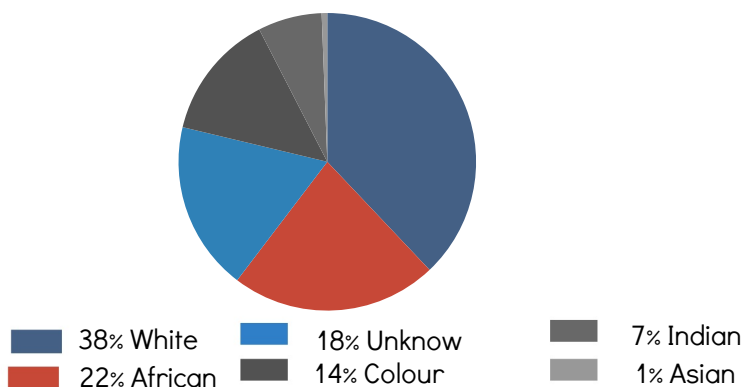

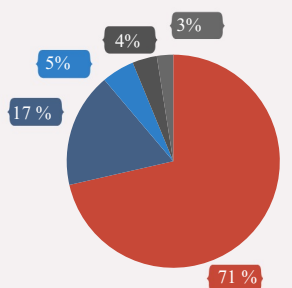

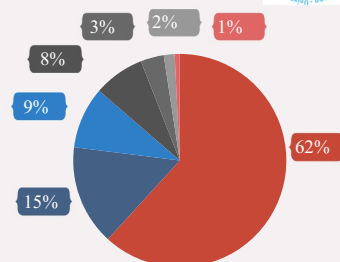
Main activity after graduation per degree level



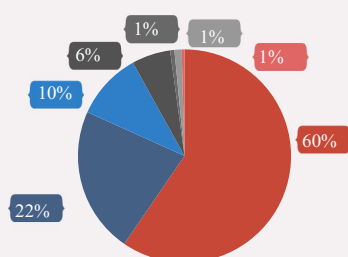

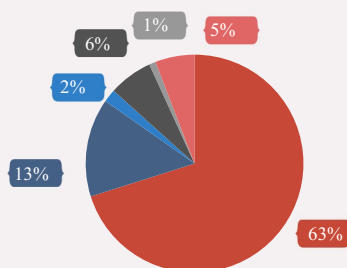
